Author Guidelines

1. The article must be submitted in electronic document format "doc and pdf file extension"
2. The number of pages of the paper should be from 10 to 12.
3. Please note that the paper size is the standard A4 size (approx 8.27 x 11.69 in).
4. Research article submitters are responsible for the accuracy of all content and references.
5. Components of the article must have all the main topics as defined in the research paper. Sort by:
 - 1) Title Article (Type your title here using 11-point Times New Roman bold font on 11-point line spacing.)
 - 2) Author Names (Use 10-point Times New Roman font on 11-point line spacing. Begin with the first name of the author followed by the last name. For two authors, type 'and' before the last author's name. For more than two authors, also separate each name by a comma (,). Identify each author's affiliation by superscript numbers at the end of the author's last name.)
 - 3) Author Affiliations (Use 9-point Times New Roman font on 11-point line spacing. Include institutional addresses for all authors. Place superscript numbers in front of the author's affiliation corresponding to author's name.)
 - 4) The abstract's length should be a maximum of 250 words and keyword 3-5 words.
 - 5) Content (The manuscript will be published in a single column style. Type text with 10-point Times New Roman font)
 - 5.1) Research Article, should have an Introduction, Objectives, literature Review, Methods, Results and Discussion and Conclusion.
 - 5.2) Pictures, tables, etc., must be used in numerical order in the article, provided the source correctly, cannot use other people's copyright.
 - 5.3) Chart should be colored contrastingly or in black and white.

References

Please follow the American Psychological Association (APA) referencing style, details of which can be found at <http://www.apastyle.org/>. References are arranged alphabetically according to the last names of the authors and the chronologically. The first line of each reference is aligned left. Use hanging style of 0.5 inched the first line of each reference.

Cited in the main text. Indicate the reference by name-year before or behind the cited content. For example, noted author, year of publication and page. Such as: Joe Smith (2014: 147) or (Newman & Cullen, 2007: 18-19) or (Joe Smith and team, 2014: 217-219)

Cited after the article. Put all bibliographical references after articles, and order according to the author's name, please refer APA format. Such as:

Structure:

Author. (Year of publication). *Book Title*. Place of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Ritcharoon, P. (2016). *Principles of measurement and evaluation*. Bangkok: House of Kermyst. [in Thai]
Yamane, T. (1967). *Statistics: An introductory analysis* (2nd ed.). New York: Harper and Row.

Basic format for *Journal*

Structure:

Author. (Year of publication). Title of Title. *Journal Title*, Volume(Issue), Page numbers.

Example:

Basic format for *Conference Technical Article/Documents*

Structure:

Author. (Year of publication). Title of Article. In Title of Editorial (Editorial). *Title of conference and seminar proceedings*. Title of conference. (Pages.). Place of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Biswas, M. (2008). Confirmatory Factor Analysis of Iso Ahola's Motivational Theory An Application of Structural Equation Modeling. *Conference on Tourism in India - Challenges Ahead* (pp. 177-188). Kozhikode: Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode.
Nasution, H. N. & Mavondo, F. T. (2005). The impact of Service quality on customer value in the hotel industry. *ANZMAC Conference 2005*, 5-7 December 2005. Fremantle, Western Australia: ANZMAC.

Basic format for *News Paper Article*

Structure:

Author. (Year, Month Day). Title of Article. *Title of News Paper*, Pages.

Example:

Sriwattanachai, R. (2014, October 24). The Prefabricated Generation of Seasoning Sauce Market. *Posttoday Newspaper*, p. 3-4. [in Thai]

Basic format for *Dissertation or Thesis*

Structure:

Author. (Year of publication). *Title of dissertation or thesis*. Ph.D. dissertation, Univ.

Example:

Seangsri, W. (2009). *An Analysis and Development of School Network Administration Model in Northeastern Rural Area*. Doctoral Dissertation, Chulalongkorn University. [in Thai]
Koufteros, X. A. (1995). *Time-Based Manufacturing: Developing a Nomological Network of Constructs and Instrument Development*. Doctoral Dissertation, University of Toledo, Toledo, OH.

Basic format for *Website/Electronic*

Structure:

Author. (Year). *Title*. Retrieved Month Date, Year, from URL Address

Example:

Department of Land Transport. (2013). *Transport statistics report in 2013*. Retrieved May 20, 2015, from http://apps.dlt.go.th/statistics_web/brochure/statreport113.pdf
Shannon, C. E. & Weaver, W. (2010). *Communication Theory: Model of Communication*. Retrieved December 2, 2016, from <http://communicationtheory.org/shannon-and-weaver-model-of-communication/>

Basic format for *Interview*

Structure:

Author. (Year, Month Day). *Interview*. Position. Dept.

Example:

Chueathai, P. (2017, January 30). *Interview*. Vice President. Rajamangala University of Technology Lanna.

Saiwanich, S. (2017, January 31). *Interview*. Vice Governor. Tak province. [in Thai]
